WhatsApp Broadcast

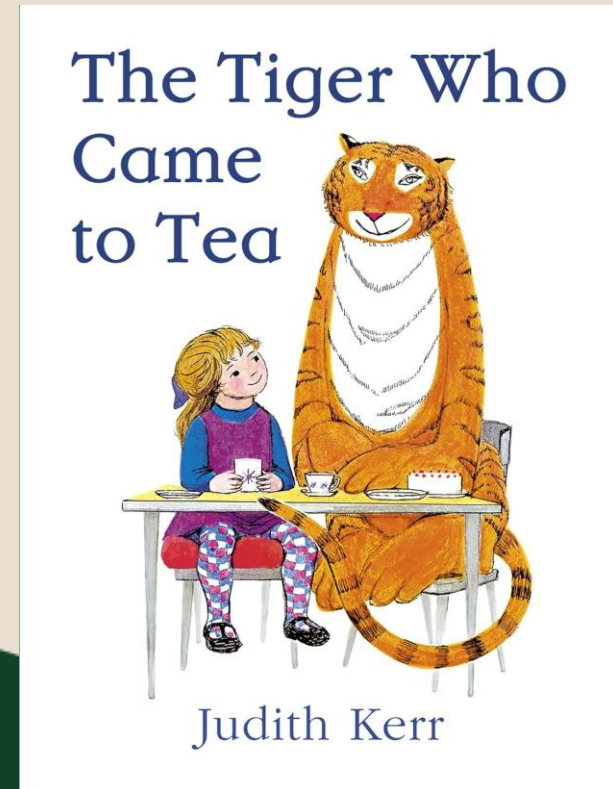

Literacy Topic

We will be looking at the story The Tiger Who Came to Tea, sharing this story with the children will create ideas, imagination and great thinking.

The areas that can be covered some examples are:

- PSED – emotions – being kind, manners
- PD – gross motor skills- crawling, jumping, prancing- like a tiger
- Fine motor skills playdough- making foods
- CL – story sequencing,
- L – reading, exploring, and extending vocab
- M – colours (food), counting, sizing, quantity
- UTW – healthy eating, animal's habitats
- EAD – experimenting with a variety of different materials and textures, sensory

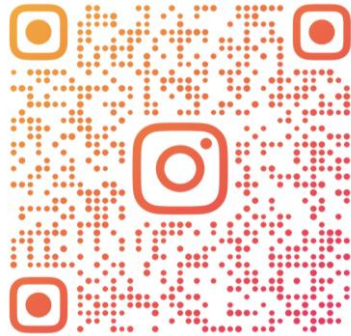
- PE with Coach Tom – Wednesday and Friday at 9.30am

Child absences - If your child is not coming into pre-school, please can you notify us first thing in the morning by either email, text or phone call, providing us a reason for their absence.

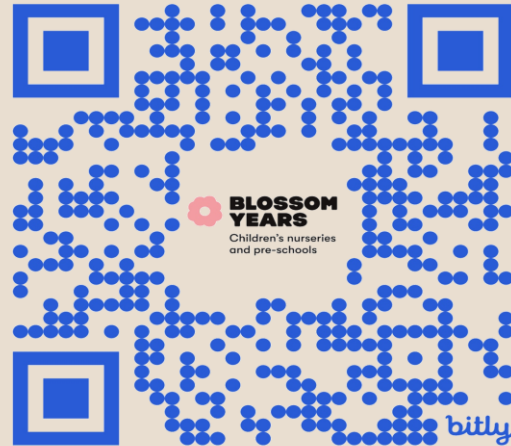
Car Park - A reminder that the car park gate will be open from 7.30am – 9.30am and again from 4.30pm – 5.50pm
